### EXPANDING THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT

Last August, Methodist Richardson Medical Center broke ground on a \$46 million expansion for an enhanced lab, pharmacy, and emergency department. By adding two new floors on top of the existing ED, 80,000 square feet of space will be created for the lab and pharmacy. Once that move is complete, the remodel will begin to add 18 new beds for the ED. If you drive by Renner Road, you can see the steel going up, as construction is well underway. All three phases are expected to be complete in spring 2024.



### STROKE AND TRAUMA TEAMS EARN DESIGNATIONS REFLECTIVE OF HIGH-QUALITY CARE

The hospital has now earned a Level III Trauma designation from the Texas EMS Trauma & Acute Care Foundation (TETAF). The recognition comes after a thorough on-site survey in late June 2022. It reflects a commitment to provide our communities with advanced, high-quality emergency care. A Level III Trauma designation means the hospital has 24-hour immediate coverage by emergency physicians and surgeons. Also in the fall of 2022, DNV Healthcare designated Methodist Richardson as a Comprehensive Stroke Center, recognizing that the hospital is able to care for the most complex stroke cases.

### NEW OUTPATIENT CLINIC SERVES CARDIAC PATIENTS

The new Methodist Richardson Heart and Vascular Center opened in April 2022. It is an outpatient clinic located in the new medical office building adjacent to the hospital, and it is staffed with physicians who specialize in cardiology, cardiothoracic surgery, and vascular surgery. The launch of this new clinic makes high-quality, innovative cardiology services accessible in one convenient location. This is the first hospital outpatient department at Methodist Richardson.

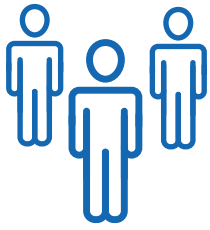


## FOUNDATION

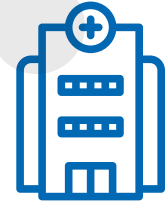

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# COMMUNITY WELLNESS/SERVICE AND SUPPORT

## FAITH COMMUNITY NURSING

Through local churches, Methodist Health System provides education and health outreach, including flu shots and biometric screenings.

## METHODIST GENERATIONS

This program offers a variety of wellness activities, social events, and educational outreach for people ages 55 and older.

## ASIAN BREAST HEALTH OUTREACH PROJECT (ABHOP)

Last year, this program provided 460 mammogram screenings, 44 diagnostic exams, and six biopsies. ABHOP also offered breast health education to uninsured and underinsured Asian-American women.

## MOBILE MAMMOGRAPHY

Methodist's mobile mammography unit brought breast cancer screenings directly to 2,333 women this year.

## DIABETES EDUCATION

A monthly support group offers tips for managing diabetes, including diet, exercise, and insulin use.

## METHODIST ALLIANCE FOR PATIENTS AND PHYSICIANS (MAP2)

This accountable care organization (ACO) improves and saves lives through coordinated care for more than 85,000 people. These patients have seen overall improvement in health measures, as well as a lowered overall cost of care. For these efforts, MAP2 has achieved national recognition for the quality of care given to patients.

## MEDASSIST

This program provides vital bridge medications — 67 prescriptions in the past year — to patients in financial need. Through pharmaceutical partnerships, MedAssist also connected patients to 436 prescriptions for free medications valued at over \$300,000.

## RICHARDSON ISD WELLNESS CLINIC

Methodist Richardson partners with Richardson ISD to offer a dedicated clinic for school employees, as well as Network of Community Ministries.

## WILDFLOWER RETURNS!

After a two-year hiatus, Richardson's favorite celebration, the Wildflower! Arts and Music Festival, triumphantly returned to Galatyn Park. And once again, Methodist Richardson sponsored the main stage. The three-day summer event is one of Richardson's most popular attractions, typically drawing about 70,000 visitors.

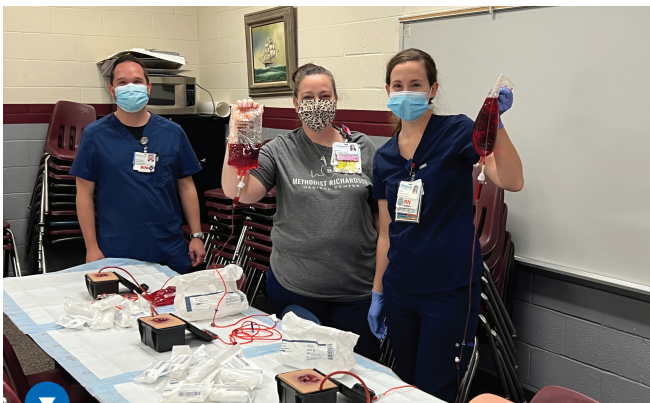


### MPMC SERVES AS SANTA'S ELVES

Methodist Richardson has once again been honored for nursing excellence, as the hospital earned re-designation as a Magnet organization from the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC). Methodist Richardson first achieved Magnet status in 2016. The recognition affirms Methodist Richardson's dedication to Magnet culture, which improves processes and patient outcomes. ANCC continually raises the bar, so hospital leaders are proud that the nursing staff meets the credentialing center's high expectations. According to ANCC, fewer than 9% of U.S. hospitals have earned Magnet designation.
